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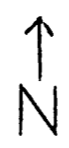

when the records were not well kept and later were recon-  
structed so that between #69 (4-5-1890) and #83 (6-27-1890)  
some burial records were discovered and listed with dates  
when possible and showing "unknown" if necessary. The dated  
entries are out of sequence as to the date of burial.
