MASONIC HOME CEMETERY

The Masonic Cemetery was at one time located next to the Darlington Orphanage (now the Game Farm operated by the State).

Mr. J. Fred Latham, P.G.M., writes us: "I had a part in the moving of the remains of those who had been interred in the Masonic Home Cemetery at Darlington. I had been the Grand Master for the year 1943 and had visited the Cemetery during the year and finding it to be in a deplorable condition I made recommendation to our Grand Lodge that we proceed to move those remains. This was done the following year under the direction of the Brown Funeral Home of Enid, Oklahoma. The task was completed June 21, 1944."

"Those remains were interred in SUMMIT VIEW CEMETERY here at Guthrie, Oklahoma, using the same markers as originally set. The Masonic Home was moved to Guthrie from Darlington in the year 1923, however, the remains of those buried there were not removed until some 21 years later, as stated above."

"My personal library does not have a record of the names of those whose remains were removed to Guthrie and it may require quite sometime to locate that information. I'll try to supply you this at a later date. You are to be commended for your efforts. As indicated above, there are so many occasions where valuable information is not properly recorded. We make history daily but seldom properly record it."

I had been the Grand Master for the year 1943 and had visited the Cemetery during the year and finding it to be in a deplorable condition I made recommendation to our Grand Lodge that we proceed to move those remains. This was done the following year under the direction of the Brown Funeral Home of Enid. The task was completed June 21, 1944.

Those remains were interred in Summit View Cemetery here at Guthrie, using the same markers as originally set. I am quite well acquainted with Brother S. Boyd Wilson, Jr., knew his father and grandfather. Your letter says these remains were moved sometime about 1926. That is in error. The Masonic Home was moved to Guthrie from Darlington in the year 1923, however, the remains of those buried there were not moved until some 21 years later, as stated above.

My personal library does not have a record of the names of those whose remains were removed to Guthrie and it may require quite some time to locate that information. It may require a visit to the Cemetery and survey the grave markers. I'll try to supply you at a later date.

You are to be commended for your efforts. As indicated above, there are so many occasions where valuable information is not properly recorded. We make history daily but seldom properly record it.
